MINISTRY REPORTS FOR 2019

Just so you can get some idea of what is going on numerically in the ministry in Sri Lanka I've included a few items to report for the past years work by our preachers.

We had 68 baptisms during the past year which is up from years past. Primarily this is due to the 3 new house churches our preacher from Mahiloor, Sutha, has helped to organize and is working with.

For VBS last August there were 578 different children who came for the week long programs and a daily average of 324 children.

This is down from years past due mainly to the Easter Sunday bombings which actually caused the closing of most of the churches satellite Sunday school programs. Parents were afraid to send their children for fear of more bomb attacks on Christians which was a definite concern. But the programs went well and new children, as well as their families, were exposed to the Gospel.

For Christmas we always give special gifts for the children who have perfect attendance which was 53 children. In addition to the regular Christmas gift we give them a back pack filled with school supplies. This is a huge thing as these supplies are a big expense for many of the parents.

Those children who come for 90% or more Sundays receive in addition to the regular Christmas gift, school supplies.

This year the churches also recognized the children who had memorized the Bible verses assigned each week, they received a certificate and a medal.

PREACHERS SUBMIT GOALS FOR 2020

Each year our preachers pray about and set goals for the coming year. This includes the number of new contacts they will make, people they will work with to bring to Christ, those they train for different areas of service within the church and those they want to send to Bible school for training for ministry.

This may not sound earth shattering to you but you have to understand that the Sri Lankan culture sets few goals for anything, is' normal and easy to just float along.

I'm reminded of the old saying of, "if you aim at nothing you're bound to hit it". We've seen significant changes in attitude and efforts put forth when they set goals and are reminded of them periodically.

The goals set are too varied to mention and most are centered on evangelism, overall I was pleased with what they submitted. Please pray that they will indeed work to fulfill these goals.

Tharshini is busy assisting in Sunday school in the Koddai Kallar church and helping at home with cooking and cleaning.

Prashanth has started school again and is busy with studies and tutoring classes he attends.

I received a letter from NVC concerning the visa applications and once again they have asked for more and different documents to be submitted which I was able to do just this last week. One had to be signed by Prashanth so I had to email it to Sri Lanka, have it signed, scanned and emailed back here so I could submit it.

I'm also beginning to make plans to return to Sri Lanka toward the end of March. I want to see the ministry, spend some time with the preachers, and see my kids who I miss terribly; it's been four years since I have seen them.

A niece in Sri Lanka had a baby boy just 3 days ago. He was having a little difficulty breathing but is doing okay; Sona my niece is doing well.
