Because of this situation we will face many challenges if we can have VBS this year. We want to restart the Sunday school programs in the churches again before we could have VBS but until now the government has not given permission to restart Sunday schools.

My wife Sona has been suffering with pain in her backbone for 2 months.

We recently went for a medical checkup. After getting the X ray the doctor said one of her back bone joints is dislocated because of unbalanced walking and her body weight. (Sona's difficulty in walking is due to the leg surgeries she had to rebuild the leg bone. This went on for several years. The end result is there is leg bone but the leg is enough shorter she has to wear a built up shoe but walking is still off balance.)
